Output 1. The status of the Ascension Island green turtle nesting population is updated and population estimates are made widely available.

Output 2. The efficiency of alternative monitoring protocols is evaluated through simulation-based modelling.

Following changes in project staffing arrangements described in first Annual Report, no further progress has been made on this key output during the current reporting period. As such, we are currently behind where we had planned to be at this stage. Further explanation is provided below and we have submitted a change request in conjunction with this report proposing a short extension which will allow us to make up lost ground.

Output 3. Novel technologies that may one day supplement or replace existing monitoring methods are reviewed and assessed for suitability and field readiness.

A literature review of the use of novel technologies in marine turtle monitoring has now been completed. In addition, a proposal to host a **'novel monitoring technologies'** workshop at the 41st International Sea Turtle Symposium (ISTS) in Colombia has also been accepted. The ISTS is the principal international meeting for sea turtle researchers and marine managers, so the planned workshop presents an opportunity to bring together colleagues working at high density nesting populations around the world to present the findings of our literature review and discuss any emerging technologies that could streamline monitoring programmes at Ascension Island and similar locations globally. This represents a significant enhancement of our original objective to host a by-invitation online workshop. However, due to the timing of the event (March 2023), it is contingent on the no-cost extension we are requesting being granted.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments/lessons learnt that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

As detailed in previous project reports, the project leader from the University of Exeter has had to significantly reduce his time commitment to this project after moving to a permanent faculty position. A replacement has been appointed. However, they are splitting their time across two parallel Darwin Plus projects that Dr Weber was previously employed on (current project and DPLUS113) and it has understandably taken them time to familiarise themselves with the different projects, datasets and methods involved. We are therefore behind where we had planned to be at this stage. A change request has been submitted to the Darwin Secretariat in conjunction with this report proposing a no-cost extension until the end of the current financial year to give us additional time to complete planned outputs.
